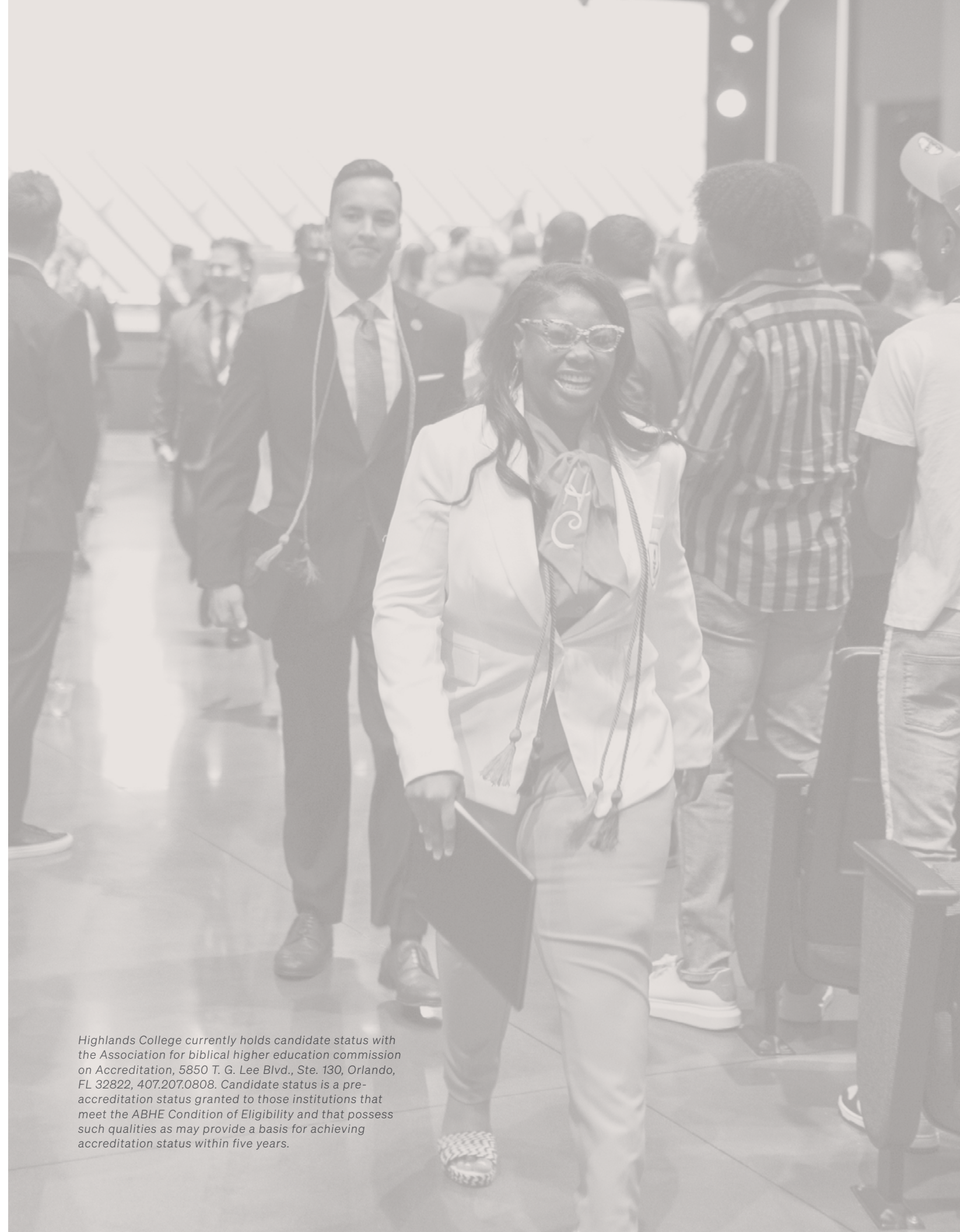

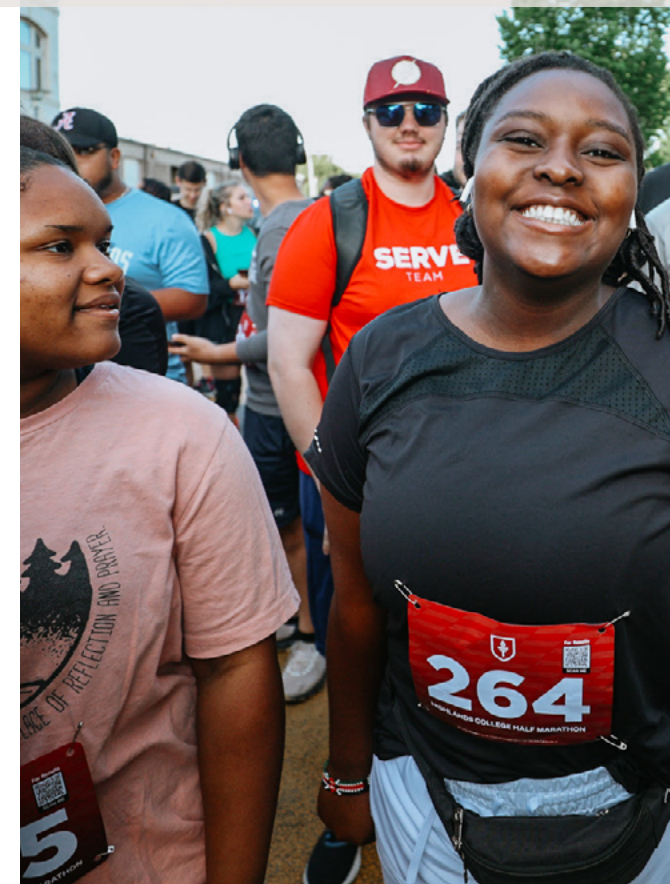

In January 2020, during my second semester at Highlands College, my family faced financial challenges. We knew we needed God to perform a financial miracle if I was going to be able to stay at Highlands College. We didn't share our needs with anyone or apply for a scholarship, but as a family, we earnestly committed to prayer, trusting, and believing God to move in a powerful way! It was day 11 of Church of the Highlands' annual 21 Days of Prayer in January when I received a phone call from the College telling me I had just been given a scholarship from an anonymous donor. This scholarship would cover my tuition for the remainder of my time at Highlands College!

Receiving the scholarship changed everything for me and my family completely! It reminds me of how good God is and how He always keeps His promises. The scholarship allowed me to stay in HC and continue learning, being stretched, and growing in my calling.

I will forever be so grateful for my time at Highlands College and the generous donor who walked in obedience to the Lord. Their generosity made it possible for me to continue my journey at HC. I graduated in May 2022, equipped for a life of full-time ministry.

## RECRUITING + ADMISSIONS

### *Recruitment Story*

While on a recruitment trip in Texas over a year ago, members of the Recruitment Team met a girl who felt called to full-time ministry. Pam had been working and saving money for college, but at the time she was interested in attending a different ministry school than Highlands College.

Fast forward a year and the Recruitment Team is on another trip to the same area when they run into Pam again—still working to save money for college. She said she had recently questioned whether ministry school was still God's plan for her. Within a few days of having these doubts, she saw these familiar faces from Highlands College, and they remembered her name. She believed this moment was God reconfirming His call on her life.

Because of the generosity of Highlands College's faithful supporters, the Recruitment Team was able to offer her a full scholarship on the spot for attendance in the fall. She no longer has to feel the financial burden of furthering her education and becoming the ministry leader God has called her to be.

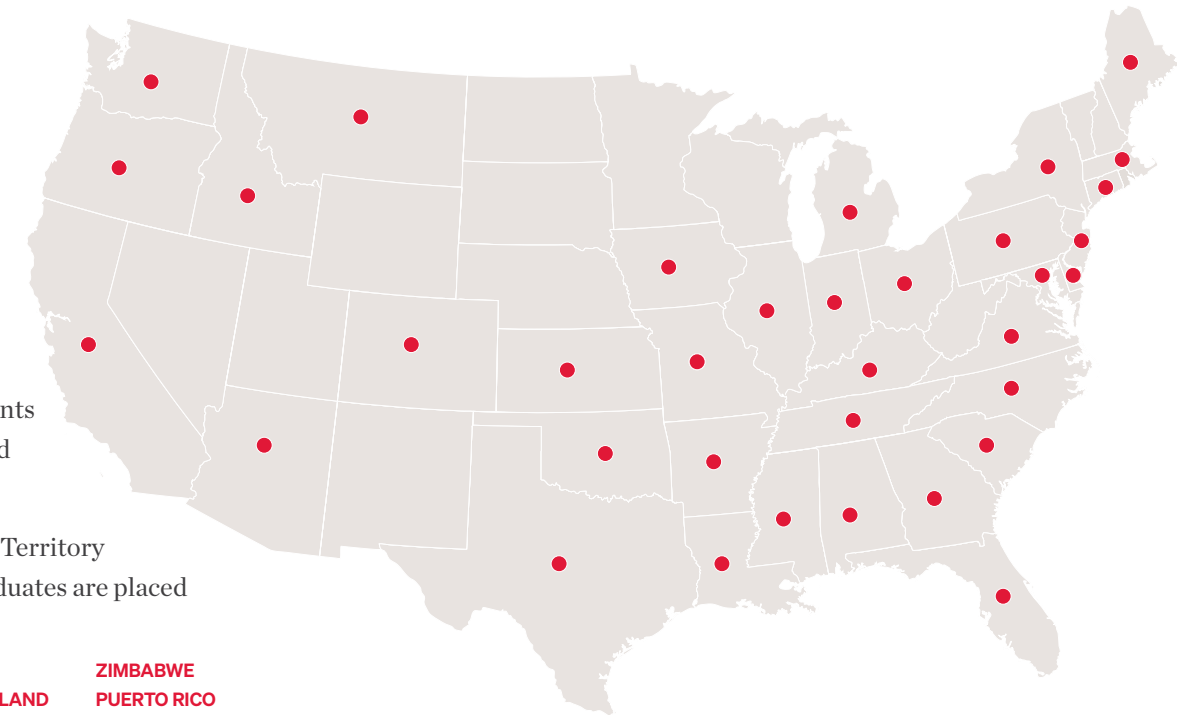

# Placement

*Philanthropists funding an Endowed Student Scholarship in memory of Harrison McClain*

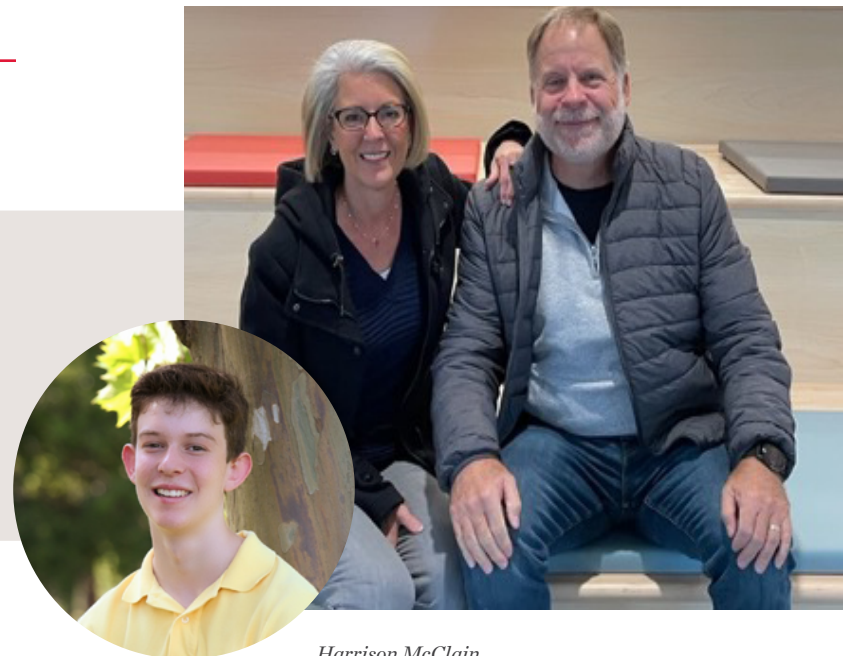
### *Honoring the Life and Faith of a Special Young Man*

“We had talked about doing the scholarship before,” said John Guice. “But when Harrison passed, we immediately decided to honor him and his family through a scholarship.”

Harrison McClain was the son of a dear family friend. He suffered a stroke at age 14 but persevered through recovery and rehabilitation. His life was returning to normal when a drunk driver struck the car Harrison was a passenger in and cut his life short, killing him instantly.

“He was a blessing to those who knew him for his 15 years,” Elizabeth Guice said. “He was never bitter and said his stroke brought him closer to God. He would say, ‘if I can lead one person to Christ, I’m happy.’ This scholarship made perfect sense to us because it honors his spirit and who he was.”

The scholarship is in Harrison’s memory, but the actual name of the award is Joshua 1:9 because Harrison’s mother prayed this verse over him every day since he had the stroke.

The Guices’ ten-year connection to Church of the Highlands began through Elizabeth’s son, which led them to choose Highlands College for their generous gift. “We hope to take the financial burden off students called to ministry. We want to support students who are strong and bold in their faith and want to answer whatever God calls them to do in their lives,” Elizabeth said.

## BRITT HANCOCK AND MOUNTAIN GATEWAY

*Philanthropist and nonprofit founder funds Endowed Student Scholarship to uphold the Hammock family legacy*

### *Connections in Christ Lead to Scholarship Honoring Father*

Dusty Hammock’s father was a lifelong educator, passionate about teaching and helping students succeed in their education. When Dusty first learned about the Endowed Student Scholarship (ESS) opportunity at Highlands College and how it could help one student every year in perpetuity graduate debt-free, he knew this was something he wanted to establish to honor his father and his love for education.

“My father died 15 years ago,” Dusty said. “My wife and I always wanted to fund an ESS in memory of him, but we didn’t have the money to do it.”

That’s when an old family friend, Britt Hancock, stepped in to help.

“My family and Britt’s family used to attend church together,” Dusty explained. “I’ve known him since he was nine and have worked with him for several years. He knew my father well and also wanted to honor his memory.”

Britt and his wife, Audrey, spent 16 years on the mission field and 33 years in full-time ministry. They established and currently run a nonprofit called Mountain Gateway that exists to train and send out missionaries around the world.

In addition to his relationship with Dusty, Britt also had a long-term connection to Church of the Highlands Senior Pastor Chris Hodges. “They had known each

other for a long time. Britt knew Chris before Chris came to Birmingham. He trusts Chris and his vision for the College,” Dusty shared.



Britt also deeply believes in the mission of Highlands College. Through Mountain Gateway, Britt and Audrey have generously funded the ESS in memory of Dusty’s father and have given another significant gift to the College.

“This isn’t just about my dad,” Dusty said. “It’s about the fact that Britt is a very generous person. He is generous, loving, intense, and obedient to what Jesus tells him to do.”

“You reap what you sow,” said Britt, who grew up in Alabama. “We believe in the strategy of the College. We’ve been missionaries for years and now train them ourselves. We are dedicated to sowing. We want to sow more seeds. We believe in Chris and Tammy’s vision and mission for Highlands College and want to invest in what they’re doing.”

# Impact Stories



## JONATHAN ROBERTSON

2022 Alumnus | Students Practicum | Intern

I have known God existed from a young age and that He loved me. Both of my parents were children’s ministry pastors, so I spent a lot of time in church when I was growing up.

During those younger years, I developed a deep love for God and His people; however, my faith was also tested and challenged in those same years. My mom passed away from breast cancer when I was three years old. We were a family of eight, so my dad left his job in ministry to work full-time to provide for his six kids. Regardless of how difficult this season was, he still made an effort to emulate a genuine faith while serving in the church.

Following his example of a servant’s heart, when I was fifteen, I started serving as much as possible in my youth group under my youth pastor. My walk with Jesus was at an all-time high, and it felt like things were perfect. During this time, my dad entered the hospital after having a stroke. It was a terrifying season, and things seemed insecure, but I knew I needed to find my hope in God, not my circumstances. My dad ultimately passed away after multiple complications from the stroke, and for the first time, everything seemed so uncertain. At this moment, I felt the comfort of God like no other.

The following season found me diving deeper into God’s Word, His presence, and in community with His people. In that season, I heard the Lord say that He would use me to guide a generation of students to Him like He had used my

youth pastor to guide me. I knew that ministry was where I needed to go, and that’s when my sister told me about Highlands College. She was a current student and shared their unique program and its effectiveness with me. I visited a Chapel service, felt the presence of God, and later, the Lord confirmed that HC was my next step.

While at HC, I grew tremendously. In my academic classes, I learned how to study the Word of God and how to create sustainable learning habits. My intramural sports, Expedition, and the half-marathon pushed me to have godly character even when I felt weak. My practicum instructors and local Church of the Highlands campus leaders cared about me and helped train me in my area of ministry.

*Above all this, most importantly, I fell more in love with Jesus while at Highlands College.*

My relationship with Him has never been stronger or deeper. I graduated in May 2022, and now I get to intern with one of the local campuses at Church of the Highlands and continue to pursue God’s calling on my life for the Church and the next generation.

## CHYNA PATTERSON

Chyna Patterson attended the Motion Student Conference the summer before her senior year of high school and visited the HC Snapshot during one of the conference breaks. This snapshot was a fun, informational preview of Highlands College, but for Chyna, it was a seed God planted that would be watered a little while later during the conference. She vividly recalls the moment she felt God call her to ministry. “It was the Me + Motion moment, and the song was ‘Run to the Father,’ and I knew this was where I wanted to be.”

The moment you say “Yes” to God is usually the moment you face your greatest opposition. Chyna faced a difficult decision—choosing between attending Highlands College to pursue full-time ministry or attending a traditional college where she had received a full scholarship. Finances stood between her purpose and God’s plan. So Chyna committed to praying and fasting during her senior year for God to make it clear which direction she was to go. God honored her commitment and rewarded her with a Highlands College scholarship for the incoming fall semester. Because of Highlands College’s generous supporters, finances do not have to be a barrier to becoming the leader God has called someone to be.

Chyna jumped all in during her first semester. She was on fire and eager to serve but faced many trials and grief during her second semester. Her grandmother passed away from leukemia, which was a difficult time for her family, so she thought about quitting Highlands College. But Chyna clung to something her grandmother told her a few weeks before she passed: “Go back to Birmingham and make an eternal impact.”

Obedying her grandmother’s wishes, Chyna remained in Highlands College, and despite health issues of her own—heart failure, a Pars Fracture in her lower back, and a torn

labrum in her hip—she continued to grow in her relationship with the Lord. She attributes a 6:00 AM prayer small group as the catalyst for changing the trajectory of her life. This small group taught her how to pray and cultivate the presence of God in her life, ultimately changing her life forever.

Chyna graduated from Highlands College in May 2022 and received the Presidential Award, the highest achievable award. She knows none of this would be possible if not for the generosity of those who invest in the College and its scholarship program.

*“If not for the donors, I wouldn’t be where I am today. The money is more than just money; it’s my future they were looking at, and the small impact on my life is only the beginning of their impact.”*

The future awaits her, but because of Chyna’s training and equipping at Highlands College, she is prepared to pursue God’s next step and live a life of eternal impact.





## MADDIE HOLLON

Maddie was in her fourth semester at Highlands College, getting ready to graduate, and praying about her next steps. She connected with the Highlands College Ministry Placement Team and learned about an opportunity to join the team of an upcoming church plant in Frisco, Texas. After interviews and graduating in May 2021, Maddie moved to Texas that July, eager to be a part of the launch team for Cadence Church.

During her two years in the Creative Practicum at Highlands College, she learned many skills from graphic design to marketing, which helped prepare her for her new role as a communications coordinator.

As Cadence Church was preparing for its launch in the fall of 2021, the team worked to create an effective marketing

strategy to inform residents in and around their area that there was a new church opening soon. Maddie helped their team create as many advertisements as possible, inviting residents to visit on their opening day.

Six months later, Brandon and his fiancé saw the church's ad and decided to visit on Easter Sunday. They knew the moment they walked in that this would be their new church home; however, they were still questioning some things about Christianity. They decided to keep coming back each week and even began bringing others with them.

After faithfully coming week after week, Brandon gave his life to Christ and followed with baptism a couple of weeks later. He has since joined the church, jumped into small groups, and continues taking the next steps in his relationship with the Lord.

Maddie's story is an excellent example of why Highlands College exists—to supply the Church with leaders of competence, character, and spiritual maturity, holistically trained to lead lives of eternal impact by fulfilling the Great Commission. So more people like Brandon can know God, find freedom, discover their purpose, and make a difference.

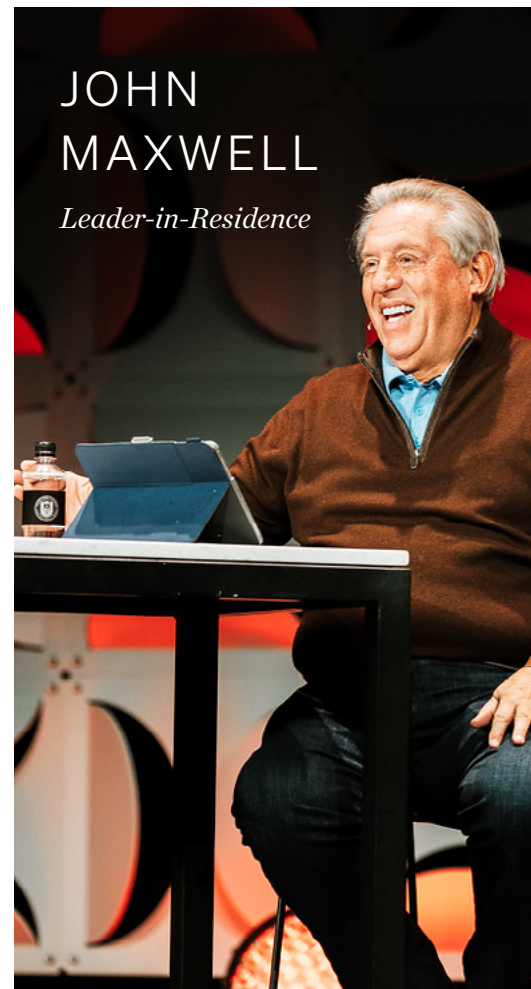

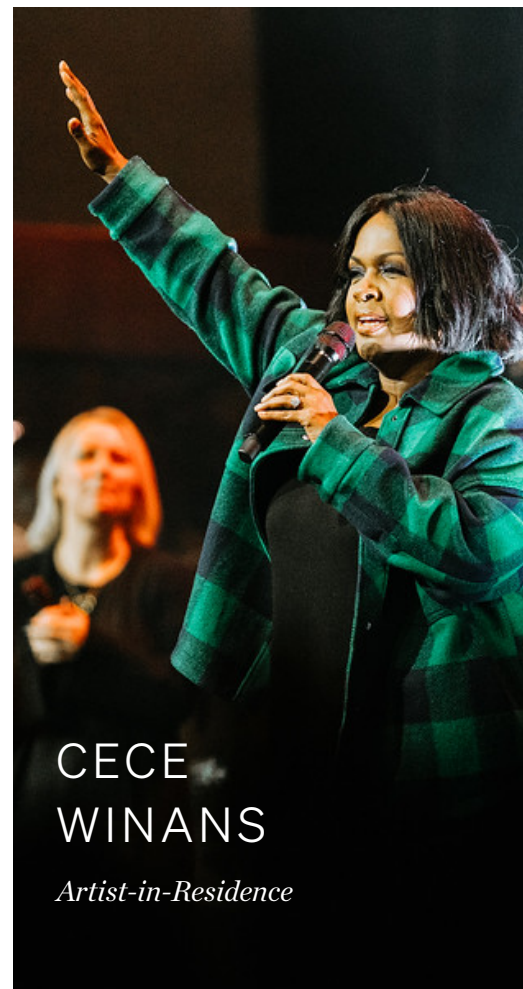

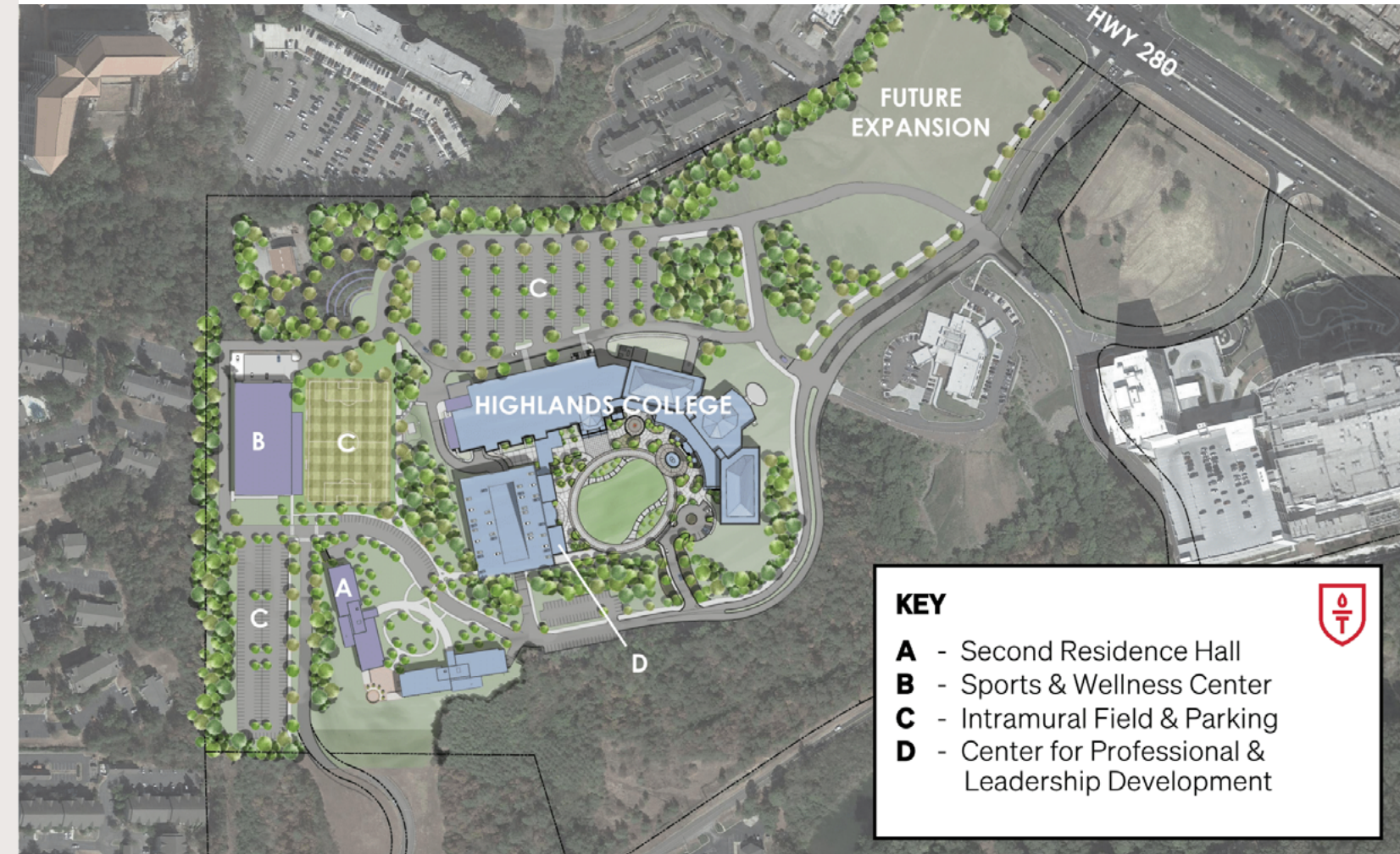

## MASTER FACILITIES PLAN & SCHOLARSHIPS

The Highlands College that holistically trains students to lead lives of eternal impact demands more than a renovated building with state-of-the-art technologies and a brand new Residence Hall furnished with 252 beds. It requires more than \$100 Million for 1,000 students to graduate debt-free in perpetuity until Jesus comes back. The Phase II vision for Highlands College's future comprises a sports and wellness center, an intramural field and sports courts, a second Residence Hall, endowed scholarships, and much more.
